His popularity as governor prompted the Chicago Tribune to declare that his popularity in Illinois was "second only to Michael Jordan's." Edgar has served in a variety of leadership roles, including President of the Council of State Governments, as a member of the executive committee of the National Governors' Association and as chairman of the Midwest Governors' Association. He has also been a Resident Fellow at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University. Governor Edgar serves on a variety of civic and corporate boards of directors.
