

The General Education Curriculum (GEC) at Lake Forest College provides an integrated framework for all Lake Forest College students. Students may satisfy most of the Lake Forest General Education Curriculum requirements in transfer as listed below.

This information only pertains to courses transferable to the *GEC credit*, not necessarily for credit toward an academic major. Courses may be transferable for elective credit, but not necessarily for credit towards a major and/or minor. **Academic departments are responsible for determining which course credits may be applied toward a major or minor.** After departmental review, in certain limited cases students may be required to repeat a course, which may result in the loss of transfer credit.

FIRST-YEAR STUDIES (1 course)

FIRST-YEAR WRITING (1 course)

NATURAL SCIENCES & MATHEMATICS

A minimum of three semester hours from each of two different academic areas. Must be 100 level or above.

HUMANITIES

A minimum of three semester hours from each of two different academic areas. Must be 100 level or above.

SOCIAL SCIENCE

A minimum of three semester hours from each of two different academic areas. Must be 100 level or above.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY

Two courses from two different academic areas, which may also be applied to major or other general education requirements.

HARPER COLLEGE COURSE

Students transfer more than 13 semester hours to Lake Forest College, and those transferring in the spring semester are exempt.

Students transferring more than 25 semester hours to Lake Forest College are exempt. English Composition or another course approved by Lake Forest College will also exempt a student.
