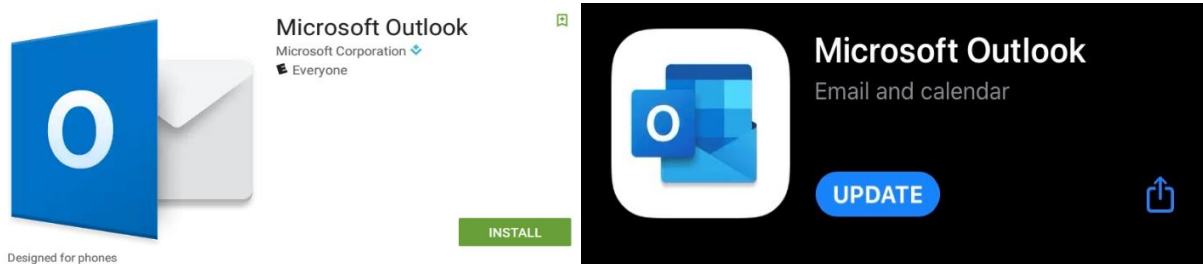


Accessing Your Lake Forest College Webmail

As we transition to remote learning, it is **crucial** that students check their Lake Forest College email to keep up with course information and other important College updates.

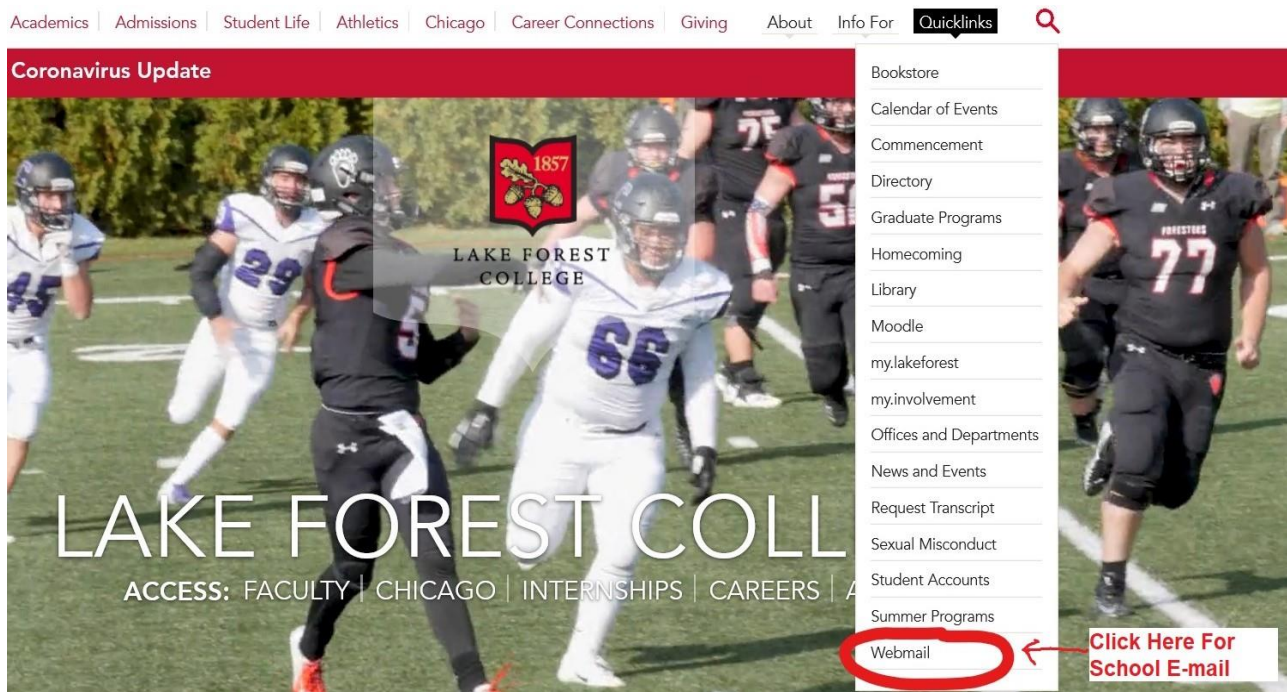
For mobile access, the “Microsoft Outlook” app can be found in the iOS App Store and Google Play Store:
