

Career Planning Checklist:

A Resource for First-Years and Sophomores

This list of actions is designed to help you move forward with your career planning and explore career paths and opportunities that fit your goals.

- Join one or more of the <u>Career Pathways</u> and mark your calendar for upcoming events (including Career Month in February: <u>Business, Finance, and Data Science, Creative Arts and Communication, Law and Public Service, Science and Health Care, or <u>Build Your Own</u> Pathway).

- **Develop and update your resume.** Review resume resources on Handshake, including sample resumes for each Career Pathway. Add experiences from this year, such as relevant coursework, work or internship opportunities.
- Connect with your career advisor and use the CAC's resources. You can make a virtual appointment on Handshake to meet with an advisor via phone or video. Access career planning resources on Handshake, register for upcoming webinars and virtual events, and keep up to date with Career Pathway Newsletter emails every other Tuesday.
- Explore different career options and learn about yourself. Take a Focus 2 Survey (new users access code-"forester"), that will provide you with a work interests assessment, based on your values, skills, personality and leisure activities.
- Build your network through virtual connection. Read about how to create and maintain connections in career fields of interest to you. Create a LinkedIn account and connect with the people you know, then search for alumni on LinkedIn who have careers you are interested in or who have similar interests. Also see this informative post "30 Things College Students Should be Doing on LinkedIn Right Now."
- Conduct virtual informational interviews on platforms like Zoom or Skype, or even a phone call. Do you have a family friend, relative or other contact who does work you're interested in? Have you connected with alumni or other professionals on LinkedIn? Ask if they have time for a virtual "informational interview" to learn more about their career and how to gain experience and skills applicable to the field it's a great way to add someone to your network!
- Identify opportunities for spring, summer or fall. Find jobs and internships in Handshake, part-time local jobs like babysitting and tutoring in QuadJobs, additional internships on Internships.com, or volunteer opportunities on Volunteer Match. Also see the Career Milestone Guide Identifying and Researching Companies/Organizations. If you are a rising



junior or rising senior, you can consider pursuing a Summer 2021 or Fall 2021 internship for credit; however, sophomores who wish to participate must submit a written appeal. Get the process started by completing the Internship Interest Survey and talking with your faculty advisor about when it might work for your academic schedule Learn more about academic (for-credit) internships here.

 Plan ahead for graduate school if you are considering continuing your education. Conduct research on programs of interest, requirements, and any standardized tests you will need to take to qualify.
