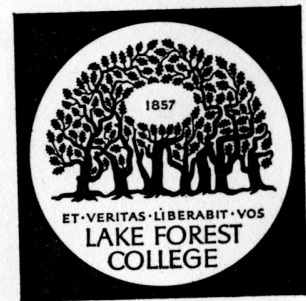

COMMENCEMENT NOTES

CAPS AND GOWNS

Academic caps and gowns represent a tradition which has come down from the universities of the Middle Ages. They were common forms of clothing and were retained by the clergy when the laity adopted more modern dress. The early European universities were founded by the church; the students being clerics were obligated to wear prescribed caps and gowns at all times.

The usual color for gowns in America is black. The hoods are lined with the college colors and trimmed with the color appropriate to the degree: dark blue, philosophy; brown, fine arts or architecture; apricot, nursing; orange, engineering; pink, music; purple, law; scarlet, divinity; white, arts; gold or yellow, science.

Caps are usually black, but the tassel may be of the color distinctive to the degree, except that the tassel for the bachelor of arts, science, and engineering is black, while the doctor's is made of gold thread.

This year the members of the Senior Class were allowed to decide individually whether or not to wear the traditional cap and gown.

THE PROCESSION

The procession is led by the Commencement Marshal, Dr. Edwin C. Reichert, followed by the Platform Group; the Trustees of the College; the Faculty, according to rank and according to years of service to the college; and the Seniors. The audience stands as the Marshal passes and remains standing until after the invocation.
